

#### From the Desk of Pastor Carl

#### Dear Siblings in Christ,

As we draw near to the conclusion of the Lenten season and approach the threshold of Holy Week, our hearts are filled with solemn anticipation and joyful expectation. Lent has been a time of introspection, repentance, and spiritual growth, during which we have journeyed alongside our Lord in the wilderness, seeking renewal and deeper communion with Him. As we accompanied Jesus on His final journey to the cross, let forever be reminded of His immense sacrifice for our salvation.



In the Gospel narratives, we read of Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem, greeted by adoring crowds waving palm branches and proclaiming, "Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!" (Matthew 21:9). Yet, we also know that this jubilant scene will soon give way to the solemnity of the Last Supper, the agony of Gethsemane, and the ultimate sacrifice of Calvary. As we have gone through these events, let us not forget Christ's passion, death, and resurrection with reverence and humility for all of us.

In our congregation, we have witnessed the steadfast dedication of our Sr. youth as they continue to grow in their faith journey. Their participation in Lenten disciplines, prayer, and service reflects their deepening commitment to follow in the footsteps of our Lord. We rejoice in their eagerness to deepen their relationship with Christ and eagerly anticipate the blessings that await them on their journey.

We are excited about the upcoming National Youth Gathering this summer. This gathering will give our youth a unique opportunity to unite with fellow believers from across the country, united in service, fellowship, and worship. As our Sr. youth continue to prepare for this amazing experience, let us pray for them, asking that their hearts be open to receive all that the Holy Spirit desires to impart to them during this time.

We celebrated a significant milestone in March as five of our junior youth participated in our Communion Milestone

on Palm Sunday; the Spirit's work and presence of the Risen Lord on Friday nights with many faithful volunteers working together (along with a special visit from Pastor Jesse & students) to raise another \$9000 for a life-impacting Lutheran Campus Ministry; the Spirit's work and presence of the Risen Lord at our Lenten dramas, noon services, Bible studies, 8:34 prayer alerts, and Wednesday "Journey with Jesus" postings; the Spirit's work and presence of the Risen Lord with meals for Palmetto Place & Children's Hospital; the Spirit's work and presence of the Risen Lord as so many dropped off hundreds of items for Lutheran Services refugee ministry welcome kits; the Spirit's work and presence of the Risen Lord at a powerful Camp Sunday celebration; the Spirit's work and presence of the Risen Lord at a Easter breakfast fellowship and a joyful egg hunt. The list goes on... and will continue in amazing ways this April with our shoe drive, community Beer 'n Hymns, and much more.

When I carried home my Easter lily last Sunday, I found special meaning in being able to place it on a table beside a poinsettia that was still bright red from our Christmas services (see photo on page 1). It somehow brought me great joy to know that the little child born in Bethlehem—who grew up to sacrifice himself for the world on the cross—had indeed survived... conquering death, suffering, rejection, mockery, abandonment, betrayal, denial, and injustice to be raised by the power of God's love and live forever as the Risen Lord! Oh, yes, Jesus lives INDEED! Christ lives in all those who have been washed in the waters of Baptismal grace, marked with his cross, and given the Holy Spirit to carry on his life-changing ministry of hope in this world, shining God's light of grace for all in countless ways... every month, every week, every day! Christ is Risen! Risen Indeed!

#### **LS LENTEN 40X40 COLLECTION: Last day for drop off is April 7!**


Hope Ministry gives thanks to all that contributed. We will be delivering the kits the week of April 8. We might not have reached 1600 items, but we have enough to make an impact in helping refugees transition into their new lives here in the U.S.

GOAL: 1600 Welcome Kit items for newly-arriving, officially-vetted refugees, through Lutheran Services "New Americans" Program!

For each **Dining Welcome Kit,** we need: 6 forks, 6 knives, 6 spoons; 6 plates; 6 bowls; 6 cups; 1 pitcher; 1 serving platter; 3 serving spoons; and 1 silverware organizer.

For each **Bathroom Welcome Kit,** we need: 6 washcloths; 6 hand towels; 6 bath towels; 1 bath mat; 1 toilet brush; 4 roll toilet paper; and 1 small waste basket.

You may donate an entire kit, or any of the items, OR make a Monetary Donation. New items only. #### BACKPACK FOOD MINISTRY

It's not about just giving a bag of food to some child for their weekend nourishment - unpacking and sorting, counting the items to make sure you have 35 on each side - 2 milk, 2 juice pouches, 2 applesauce & 1 fruit cup, a ramen noodle & some meat item, pudding cup & a cookie, 2 cereals, a spoon and lastly 4 different snack items (hhhmmm what would I like as a snack?), put it in a bag & tie it shut; but while you're doing this, you fellowship with people you don't see during the week or sometimes for a month. At the end of all of this (probably about 2 hours), you come together around the shopping carts and pray for the children that need this supplemental meal.

Once a week on Thursday, three separate meal packets will be delivered to the Opportunity Center on Omarest Dr. Living Springs has been a supporting church in this program that provides shelter and support for families that fall short for some reason or another and need assistance in getting back on their feet. ### DR. MARK ALLAN POWELL LEADS PRE-ASSEMBLY BIBLE STUDIES

May 7, 14, 21 and 28 at 7 PM



The SC Synod of the ELCA has collaborated with Dr. Mark Allan Powell and he will be leading four online Bible study sessions as our synod prepares for the Synod Assembly. This opportunity will be available for anyone who is interested. The first session will consider our overall theme, "Like Good Stewards", and the following three sessions will consider the subthemes of stewarding creation, offering, and justice & peace. These sessions will be held on May 7, 14, 21 and 28 at 7 PM. Please watch for more information as to how to participate in these sessions.

Dr. Mark Allan Powell is a retired Professor of New Testament at Trinity Lutheran Seminary. He is editor of the Harper Collins Bible Dictionary, (the world's best-selling dictionary of the Bible) and author of Introducing the New Testament, (the world's best-selling New Testament textbook). In all he has published more than 40 books on religious subjects, including one of the 21st century's most popular books on stewardship, Giving to God: The Bible's Good News about Living a Generous Life. Powell also produced a set of DVDs that have been widely used in the ELCA, titled Our Duty and Delight: The Good News of Biblical Stewardship. An ecumenical, global scholar, Powell has taught at seminaries in Chicago, Berkeley, Estonia, Russia, and Tanzania.

A couple weeks later, I decided to do it again since I felt so welcome the first time and ... was still bored. Well this went on for a couple more weeks, and at one visit her mother came into the restaurant on her way home from work. Her daughter, the bartender, introduced me to her. Well, we began to talk and I found out that she was a representative of a senior care company. As I had been looking into what I was going to do and where I was going to live as an aging "senior", she gave me some literature to review to see if her company could be of service to me. Long story short, after several phone calls to my Long-Term Care insurance provider to arrange payments, I decided to engage their company to begin a care-giver program for myself. I was assigned a truly wonderful, caring, smart, efficient, (and the superlatives keep on going) Christian lady who has made my life marvelously easy since coming to take care of me. #### Wednesday Lenten Dramas




