- **Jesus Feeding the 5000 with Two Fish and Five Loaves of Bread**: Witnessing the power of Jesus' miracles and the importance of sharing.






lowship, and allowing the Holy Spirit to work within us to "Shine God's Light."

# Notes from: Living Springs Child Development Center From Tammy Mancuso, Director

Blessings to all during this HOT introduction to our Summer,

The sun shines brightly, a breeze gently blows, and flowers begin to wilt as they ask for the rain to come and quench their thirst. We see squirrels scurry along the fence in search of food or shelter from the heat, Katie waits at the door for a fresh bowl of water and the children are excited about waterplay. The signs of Summer are obvious. Even in the heat and excitement that summer brings, we continue to be blessed with experiences of Hope.

We have so many opportunities to share Hope among our children, families, staff, and the community. A few of the exciting things we have done to kick off summer have included:

Taking a field trip to Rice Estates to pass out the Father's Day cards that the children made and taking the opportunity to visit with our senior friends.

VBS, where our LSLC-CDC children and staff were able to participate in activities with church and community members, expanding our experiences by meeting new people.

We invited guests to visit and share their expertise on safety, health, and wellbeing. During a visit from our local fire department, the firefighters let the children hold the fire hose as it was on, they were shocked at the weight and power of the water hose! A group from DHEC shared information about dental health and two nursing students from Midlands did a demonstration on germs and the effectiveness of handwashing.

One of our Summer Campers was very excited to explore how to create a circuit board, they created a complete circuit in which the batteries connected to a button, and a push pad which then sounded a small alarm. Our Summer Campers learned about heat by making and experimenting with thermometers. Our 5-year-olds and Summer Campers will be cooking quesadillas in solar ovens that they have made using pizza boxes, then taking them to make S'mores for the 4th of July.

Our staff and families were able to take a day off in honor of Juneteenth, and we are ending the month by celebrating Pride with our colorful "Pride Pasta". #### **Crafty Ladies**

We have finished 3 new quilts since we last met. Pictured are a lovely red and cream paisley quilt by Beverly Hoppert, a pieced quilt in browns and cream by Jeannie Hurlbert, and a bright pink, green and white lap quilt by Dawn Willingham. Thank you all for your work.

A new quilter joined us last time, Betty Slojewski. Betty and her husband are new to Columbia Northeast. Please welcome Betty when you see her at services or this Saturday morning quilting.

Thanks to Barb Imbert we have two new quilt tops and backs to layer. I want to try something different, if possible. After the quilt is layered, pinned, and trimmed, let's un-tape the quilt, roll it up lengthwise, and move it to another

table where it can be tied while comfortably seated. Starting at one edge, as each row is tied the quilt can be pulled forward to tie the next row. If this works it should be easier on delicate backs and short arms. Meanwhile, if there are enough of us, we can start the second quilt.


