

"Here We Stand Shining Together!" (from Pastor Eric)

"Streams of Light" Pastor Study Times: 10/16 @ 10:30, 10/27 @ 9:20 Weekly Online Discussion: Wednesday Postings @ Noon

Each October, the month concludes with remembrance and celebration of Reformation Day (always Oct. 31) and Reformation Sunday (this year, Oct. 27). We recall how 507 years ago (on All Hallow's Eve, October 31, 1517), a young pastor and Biblical professor named Martin Luther posted 95 Theses for discussion & dialogue in Wittenberg, Germany. Through that one simple act, the Spirit would work to shine multiple streams of God's light, reflecting a call back to the message of God's grace, the power of faith, and the core of the Scriptures which focus on Jesus Christ. Those streams of light would emanate throughout the Western world, creating a fervor. The Reformation of the church had begun! Three and half years later in April 1518, Luther would stand before a tribunal in the city of Worms, being asked to recant his various subsequent writings and statements, or face dire consequences. After a night of sleep and prayer, he would step forward and refuse to recant, pointing to the truth of the Scriptural message and declaring, "Here I stand, I can do no other."

Martin Luther was certainly not perfect—and we as Lutheran Christians, are not "followers" or disciples of Luther, but rather followers & disciples of Jesus. Yet, we remember & celebrate those grace-filled, faith-based, Christ-focused streams of light that the Spirit allowed to shine through Luther all those years ago, so much so that our 2024 Ministry Focus theme, "Shine God's light—grace for all!" still echoes Luther's Reformation light.

Also, in that legacy, we rejoice in all the ways the Spirit continues to shine those streams of light in and through us, all these years later. We

Over the next 7 days, we will have a special drive to collect 700 items for badly needed Disaster Clean-Up Buckets, as part of Lutheran Disaster Response Carolinas' efforts for Hurricane Helene assistance.

Items can be dropped off at the Living Springs office or brought to church on Sunday. You can also order via Amazon (or elsewhere) and have items shipped directly to: Living Springs Lutheran Church, 4224 Hardscrabble Rd., Columbia SC 29223.

In addition, please remember our Sunday bucket offering is currently designated for Lutheran Disaster Response Carolinas. In addition to your usual coins and dollars, checks can be placed in the bucket (payable to Living Springs, marked "Disaster Response"). You can also give electronically using your LS Givelify App.

Items should be new and all liquid items must be capped and securely tightened. Many of these items can be purchased at local dollar stores at substantial savings.

The list of items we are collecting follows. Please <u>click here to go to our donation registry</u>. It is a list that will let us take inventory of what is being donated. Please enter the number of items you will be dropping off. If we have maxed out an item, it will be removed from the online list. (We can make use of extra items if what you've bought gets taken off!)

- 5-gallon bucket with resealable lid (*If reused, please scrub clean. Do not use a bucket that has held chemicals of any kind. No screw lid. Advertisement on the outside acceptable.*)
- 4 to 8 oz pump spray air freshener
- scouring pads (No stainless steel or pads with soap in them. Remove from packaging.)
- sponges, assorted sizes including one large
- scrub brush (With or without handle.)
- reusable, lightweight multipurpose dry cleaning towels (No terrycloth, microfiber or paper towels. Remove from packaging.)
- 32 to 64 oz or two 25 oz bottle(s) of liquid laundry detergent
- 16 to 34oz bottle of liquid disinfectant dish soap
- 12 to 40 oz bottle of liquid concentrate household cleaner that can be mixed with water (No spray bottles.)
- package of 36 to 50 clothespins
- 50 to 100 ft clothesline (Cotton or plastic line.)
- dust masks (N95 particulate respirator dust masks preferred; No surgical masks.)
- pairs of heavy-duty, waterproof dishwashing gloves (Latex-free, non-surgical. Durable for multiple use. Remove from packaging.)
- pair of work gloves (Cotton with leather palm or all leather.)
- heavy duty or contractor type 30 to 45-gallon trash bags on a roll (Remove from packaging.)
- 6 to 9 oz bottle of non-aerosol insect repellent (Pump spray bottles must have protective covers. Packs of 10 to 20 insect repellent wipes also acceptable.)



Listening Process Underway

The annual Justice Ministry Listening Process began in September and continues in October. At Living Springs House Meetings we gather to talk about the problems that we see in our community that make life difficult for our neighbors and ourselves. We share what concerns us, what worries or angers us, or what keeps us awake at night. Similar House Meetings are also happening in 27 other MORE Justice congregations here in the Midlands.

On Monday, October 28th, at 6:30 pm, all of the MORE Justice congregations will meet at Incarnation Lutheran Church to vote on which community problem to address this coming year. We will get reports on what concerns were raised at the dozens of House Meetings across Columbia, we will hear from people affected by these problems, and we will discuss together what God is calling us to do. In past years we have voted to address problems of the lack of affordable housing, food insecurity, gun violence in our neighborhoods, and care for those with mental illness. We continue working in these areas and monitor the changes that are occurring and progress that we are making. At the October 28th Community Problems Assembly we will assess where we are with these existing issues and discern what's next for Justice Ministry.


