

BACKPACK FOOD MINISTRY - EXITING NEWS!!

We have been contacted by a previous social worker who has been transferred to another school about possibly providing ten (10) backpack bags for children in her newly assigned school that is not being sponsored by a community/church. The Hope Team unanimously agreed to add the bags to our current commitment which brings our Living Springs contribution to the Richland 2 backpack program to **80 bags** per week for **four schools** (Rice Creek (30); Joseph Keels (25); Blythewood Academy (15); and now Muller Road Middle (10).

Our current needs are all items: milk boxes, juice boxes, cereal, meat (we

have enough ramen noodles), applesauce/fruit cups, pudding cups, cookies & snacks (individually wrapped) or monetary contributions accepted - indicated for the backpack program.

PALMETTO PLACE / CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL MEALS

Do you like to cook? Do you have a favorite dish that you would like to share? Once a month, we provide a meal for Samantha House (a Palmetto Place residence for young adults transitioning from the unaccompanied youth house), a temporary home for six young adults. It is on the fourth Thursday of the month (November will be November 21 because of Thanksgiving) and the menu changes each month, but is basically an entree, starch, vegetable and/ or salad and a dessert. Children's Hospital meals are provided by Carolina Deli (Travis & Melanie Mooney) on the third Thursday and are funded by Living Springs - donations to this program are absolutely welcome - indicated on your donation to "Children's Hospital meals".

Notes from: Justice Ministry

Almost 200 people of faith from across the Midlands came together at the MORE Justice Community Problem Assembly (CPA) on October 28th to address community problems that affect our neighbors and us. We prayed, sang, and talked about our call to do God's work (Micah 6:8) here in Columbia!


At the CPA we heard that in Sept/Oct there were a total of 40 House Meetings across our 27 Network Member Congregations covering over 300 stories of our neighbors in need. Short videos gave us a chance to hear from some of the people affected by these problems, and we heard how MORE Justice has been making a difference. Many problems surfaced in our House Meetings, but we found out that the two most common themes were the need for Affordable Housing and for Mental Healthcare.

A highlight of the CPA was voting on which community problem to focus on this year. Network members voted to focus on the lack of affordable housing by working with our sister justice organizations in Charleston and Greenville. This will be a new dimension to our housing work, and we are hopeful that by coordinating our efforts we can make more progress toward accessible and affordable housing for all. We will also continue to work on mental healthcare by monitoring certification of law enforcement officers in Crisis Intervention Training. Our work with reducing gun violence and food security will continue as well. The CPA assembly also voted to endorse Cover SC for Medicaid expansion.

On November 4th the MORE Justice research committees will meet to discuss next steps for our work this year. We will get updates on where we are with each campaign – housing, gun violence, mental healthcare, and food security. Everyone is invited to participate and be a part of developing plans for action.

- Vacuum the Sanctuary and Narthex as part of clean -up (around 11:30 am)







