# Notes from: Justice Ministry

The LS Justice Ministry worked in December to address problems in the Midlands with food security, affordable housing, gun violence, and mental health care. During Advent it was especially clear how involved we are with food security for our neighbors.

- We heard it in the scripture: On the third Sunday of Advent John the Baptist talked about what food "justice" might look like for followers of Jesus who are "preparing the way of the Lord": *sharing* what we have, *not taking more than we need*, and *using our power* to help others (Luke 3:10-14)
- We saw it in action: In Advent the people of Living Springs collected food to share with Christian Assistance Bridge, and we made extra backpacks for hungry kids out of school for the holidays. We cared for our Meals on Wheels neighbors. We saw many other examples of care throughout the season.
- We engaged with other people of faith through MORE Justice: We asked City Council and other officials to improve access to food for neighborhoods without nearby grocery stores.
