In the Lutheran tradition, the season of Epiphany is a time of celebration and reflection, marking the revelation of Jesus Christ as the Son of God and the Savior of the world. The term "epiphany" originates from the Greek word meaning "to appear," "to show," or "to make known." It is a season rich with events and themes illuminating the nature of Christ's mission and his identity as the world's true light. It emphasizes God's self-revelation through Jesus Christ, reminding us that Jesus is the life-sustaining light of



the world. As declared in the Nicene Creed, Jesus is "God of God, Light of Light, very God of very God." In his own words, Jesus proclaimed, "I am the light of the world" (John 8:12). This light pierces the darkness of sin and death, bringing hope, joy, and renewal.

Epiphany also challenges us to recognize Jesus' dual nature as both true God and true man. This profound mystery invites us to worship and marvel at the access Jesus grants humanity to God. Moreover, Epiphany is a season of resistance to the powers of darkness and imperial violence, affirming the sovereignty of Christ over all earthly dominions.

As we celebrate through this season of Epiphany, I wanted you to know that it has brought excitement and joy to our youth as they transition from the Christmas celebration into the reflective light of Epiphany. Our gatherings, such as the time spent at Chick-fil-A and in fellowship at church, have been filled with laughter and connection. As school

of-the-art computerized training mannequins; and in one of the empty beds we placed our "streams of light" symbols, along with the portrait of Jesus (donated to LS by retired Newberry College New Testament professor, Rev. Dr. Wayne Kannaday) - see photos above. As council members prayed and read Scripture and discussed LS ministries, I could not help but be overwhelmed by the symbolism of those hospital beds just **beyond** our tables. I thought about the portrait of Jesus in his bed and Jesus' words, "inasmuch as you have done it unto one of the least of these, you have done it unto me." I thought about all the ways the Spirit calls us together here at LS (and in our own homes) -and whenever we are together, just **beyond** us, we are surrounded by God's hurting children of all ages out in the community, yearning for light. I thought about how God brings us together to be filled with God's light of love & grace, knowing that just **beyond** us are those to whom we are called to go out and reflect that light. And so indeed, as God's baptized children (filled with the Holy Spirit and marked with Jesus' cross), we are called, empowered, and blessed to go out **beyond** ourselves and reflect the light of God's grace for all!



LS MINISTRIES WITH CRISTO REY RETURNS!

Sunday, February 2 @ 4:15pm

We provide a Bible lesson, crafts, singing, and snacks for the children of our Mission Partner, Cristo Rey, in W. Columbia. We have team leaders, but 5-6 helpers are needed, plus a snack for up to 20 children. Volunteers meet at LS at 4:15 and carpool. The children speak English, so Spanish is not a requirement.

Notes from: Justice Ministry

This past month we shared our annual worship service experience for the MLK holiday with our faith neighbors in the Northeast. We were reminded of God's call to "do Justice" (Micah 6:8) as children of God. We also continued to work together through MORE Justice to address three community problem areas: food security, affordable housing, and gun violence.

This month I'd like to share more about our work to reduce neighborhood gun violence. We read and hear about this almost every day and see the effect this has on our families, children, neighborhoods, and schools. We have been asking for a problem analysis for several years, as the first step to creating a larger, more robust gun violence reduction strategy. In response, the City of Columbia went above and beyond what we asked for by establishing The Office of Violent Crime Prevention in 2023. Through this office, there are people dedicated to researching, creating, and implementing that robust gun violence reduction strategy.

Last February we were informed that a problem analysis of Columbia was completed by an outside organization, The Community Justice Action Fund, which evaluated whether the City had all of the services, programs and resources necessary to address this complex problem, pointing out where our gaps are. Since then, MORE Justice has made it a priority to follow-up with the Office. We've been to many community forums and events that the office has hosted, gathering critical insights on their current efforts. A few highlights so far:

They secured additional grants to address community-based violence reduction as well as outreach and wrap around supportive services—expanding the City's existing ecosystem by providing resources to grassroots organizations.

In the City of Columbia, total persons hit are down 44%, non-fatal shootings are down 46%, and gun murders are down 33% from last year.

The Office recognizes that there is a lot more work to be done to dive deeper into the root causes of violence, citing the need for comprehensive, systematic, collaborative approaches. The office plans to release an update from the first fifteen months detailing efforts and sharing future plans.

The LS Justice Ministry continues to prepare for the Nehemiah Action on Monday, May 12th at 6 pm. There with hundreds of other people of faith we will ask our public officials to make changes that will make our community a more just place for all of our neighbors. Q: "Why are there footballs behind the pulpit in the sanctuary?"

A: Those footballs are there because of a commitment we make to the 100+ young people who are part of our fall football devotional ministry. 

Letter From Pastor Carl

Dear Siblings in Christ,

Grace and peace to you in the name of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

When I graduated from seminary in May of 2020 and did not receive a call right away as many of my colleagues did, I found myself confused and doubtful. I had checked all the boxes, done the work, and felt ready to enter ministry, yet the path forward seemed unclear. My faith was shaken, and I wondered what the Holy Spirit was up to. During that uncertainty, my family and I embarked on a journey during the height of COVID-19 to Niagara Falls, Chicago, and Gatlinburg, Tennessee. At Niagara Falls, I preached with the mighty roar of the falls as my backdrop, feeling the power and majesty of God's creation. In Chicago, I stood by the shores of Lake Michigan, proclaiming God's word as the waves rolled in, reminding me of the steadfastness of God's love. In the mountains of Gatlinburg, I preached, surrounded by the grandeur of nature, experiencing the peace that only comes from being enveloped by God's handiwork. When we returned home, my heart was at peace, and I was ready to accept whatever the Holy Spirit had in store. Little did I know that just a month later, I would meet Pastor Eric and begin interviewing for a call at Living Springs Lutheran Church, a place that had not been on my radar but was clearly part of God's plan. This beautiful church on the corner of Hardscrabble and Clemson Road would soon become a haven for my family and me, a place that welcomed us with open arms and shaped my ministry in ways I could never have imagined.

These past years at Living Springs Lutheran Church, from January 24, 2021, to the present, have been an incredible journey of ministry, growth, challenges, and profound moments of God's grace. As I reflect on my time here, I want to express my heartfelt thanks for the privilege of serving alongside you and for the trust you placed in me to lead this congregation.

From my very first day, on Ash Wednesday, February 17, 2021, I was welcomed into a community deeply rooted in faith and resilience. It was a time of uncertainty as we navigated the ongoing pandemic, but it was also a time of incredible creativity and connection. Together, we found new ways to share the Gospel, whether through our Lenten video series portraying the passion of Christ or our joyous Easter celebrations despite the restrictions of the time. These moments were a testament to the enduring hope we have in Christ and the strength of this congregation.

Life, however, is never static. Change is inevitable. God continually calls us to new challenges, opportunities, and adventures. Over the years, we have experienced incredible highs and faced our share of challenges. The journey through the liturgical seasons has been nothing short of remarkable. Pentecost, Vacation Bible School, Campfirmation, youth trips, and GraceWorks highlighted the vibrancy of our youth and the creative energy of this congregation. The Communion Milestone Class and the joy of seeing our Little Lutherans take their first communion will remain among my most cherished memories. Witnessing our children's and youth's faith flourish has been a profound blessing.

The third chapter of Ecclesiastes reminds us of an unchanging truth: "For everything, there is a season and a time for every matter under heaven." After much prayer and discernment, I have accepted the call to serve as the Senior Pastor of Advent Lutheran Church in Melbourne, Florida, beginning March 16, 2025. Therefore, I write to tender my resignation as your associate pastor, with my last Sunday at Living Springs being March 9, 2025.

Personal Events Celebrated Together

Reflecting on these years, certain personal milestones stand out, marking the depth of our shared journey:

My first Ash Wednesday service with Living Springs, marking the beginning of a profound pastoral journey.

Witnessing our Little Lutherans receive their First Communion—a joyous and sacred moment.

Leading the Youth Mystery Trip and experiencing the Civil Rights Tour, which deepened our collective understanding of justice and faith.

Celebrating milestones like baptisms, confirmations, and the growth of youth and families in their faith journeys. These celebrations allowed me to witness firsthand how the Holy Spirit moves within this congregation.

Going downstairs and reading to our Child Development Children which later turned into Tuesday Chapel Time.

Congregational Events

The church's collective milestones were equally inspiring. Together, we have achieved remarkable things:

The "Stuff-a-Bus" initiative demonstrates our community's commitment to outreach and service.

Reformation and Trunk-or-Treat celebrations brought joy and fellowship to the congregation, fostering a sense of belonging and tradition.

The JV football ministry, feeding and spiritually supporting young athletes—an outreach that touched lives beyond our church walls.

Vacation Bible School and GraceWorks brought vibrancy and connection to our church community and highlighted the importance of faith in action.

Our Child Development May Graduations and how humbling it is to see our little ones transition to first grade.

Challenges In, Through, and Out of COVID

Navigating ministry through a pandemic presented unique challenges that tested our resilience and adaptability:

Transitioning back to in-person worship after prolonged virtual gatherings required patience and creativity.

Adjusting to new norms while fostering meaningful connections within the congregation was a continuous learning process.

Addressing the emotional and spiritual needs of children, youth, and adults in the aftermath of the pandemic reminded us of the importance of pastoral care.

Reinventing ministry approaches to maintain engagement and growth despite external challenges was necessary and a blessing.

Understanding that even through social distancing our Child Development Children thrive because our teacher cared enough to put in the extra work to teach and grow our kids in many ways.

Pastoral Goals Accomplished

Looking back, I take great comfort and pride in the goals we have achieved together:

Deepening relationships through consistent intercessory prayer and personal engagement—a cornerstone of our ministry.

Expanding youth programs to include retreats, milestone classes, and meaningful spiritual journeys that have nurtured our younger members.

Reinforcing the importance of outreach and community service as vital aspects of our mission, ensuring that our faith extends beyond the church walls.

Guiding the congregation through seasons of change with steadfast faith and hope, always pointing back to the promises of God's Word.

Finding new and creative ways to help our Child Development Children see the Bible stories in ways they understand. They helped me to explore a creative side that I did not know I had.

Gratitude and Future Hopes

As St. Paul wrote to the church at Philippi: "I thank my God every time I remember you, constantly praying with joy in every one of my prayers for all of you, because of your sharing in the gospel from the first day until now." Like Paul, I am grateful for the privilege of serving as your associate pastor. The relationships we have built, the ministry we have shared, and the love we have experienced together have profoundly enriched my life and my family.

Over these years, I have been deeply blessed by the partnership and friendship of Pastor Eric Fink. His mentorship has been awe-inspiring, marked by profound wisdom and a steadfast commitment to God's work. Pastor Eric has a way of dropping nuggets of wisdom in the most unexpected moments, leaving a lasting impression on my ministry and personal growth. His patience with me, especially when my enthusiasm might have been a bit over the top, has been a testament to his grace and understanding. Through our shared struggles and adventures, he has become the yin to my yang, balancing my energy with his calm demeanor and unexpected humor. Whether navigating the challenges of ministry or celebrating its joys, Pastor Eric has been a constant source of support and inspiration. I am deeply grateful

for our shared journey and the countless ways he has enriched my time at Living Springs.

I will always treasure the love freely given by the people of Living Springs Lutheran Church. From the moment my family and I arrived, we were welcomed with open arms and loved unconditionally. Your warmth and generosity have been a light in our lives, and that light is the reason I shine. The kindness, encouragement, and grace you have extended will never be forgotten and often be spoken about in my ministry journey. I am forever thankful for the opportunity to love you, walk with you, laugh and talk with you, and share the joys and challenges of life.

To the incredible youth of this church, you have carried me, loved me, put up with me, listened to me, taught me, opened up to me, cried with me, rode with me, sang with me, and most of all empowered me to be better. You have challenged me to think deeper and love harder, constantly reminding me of God's boundless potential in each of us. You have exemplified the beauty of authentic faith through your laughter, questions, and even moments of doubt. Watching you grow, navigate life, and embrace your spirituality has been one of the greatest privileges of my ministry. How you approach the world with courage and curiosity has inspired and humbled me as I realize how much I have learned from you. Our shared adventures—from retreats and mission trips to late-night conversations and impromptu sing-alongs—have been a testament to the joy and depth of being in community with you. You are the heartbeat of this church, and I am forever grateful for all you have given me. You have shown me the true meaning of faith, resilience, and unconditional love. For that, I am forever humbled and thankful. You have left an indelible mark on my heart, and I will carry the memories of our time together as a cherished treasure.

To the parents and children of our Child Development Center, I would like to say that I thoroughly enjoyed the time spent with the kids in Tuesday Chapel and every other time I had with them. I enjoyed their questions of exploration and how they challenged me with their questions during our chapel times. Seeing the look on their faces when they tell the story back to me is a moment to witness, especially when they say, "We got it, Pastor Carl."

Pastoral transitions are never easy, but they are vital for the growth and renewal of the church. I encourage you to embrace this season with faith and hope, trusting that God has a plan for this congregation. As I prepare to leave this role, I carry with me the community's lessons, memories, and love. Living Springs will always hold a special place in my heart. I pray that you continue to be a light in the world, steadfast in faith, hope, and love. May you always remember that Christ leads us, and may you trust in the Holy Spirit's guidance as you move forward into the future.

Thank you for allowing me to serve as your associate pastor. It has been one of the greatest honors of my life. May God bless and keep you always.

"The idea of going to camp and unplugging was something we felt was important to do," says Ken Wood. "But our kids didn't like that idea at all!"

In September, Ken and his wife Carrie took their high school and middle school children to Luther Springs for the Family Camp weekend retreat. It was the family's first trip to Luther Springs, but Ken says the information about the family weekend really caught their attention. "We were interested in some scheduled time away to prioritize our family and our spiritual life," shares Ken. "It gets more and more complicated to do that as the kids get older, so we were looking for out of the box ways to be together."

Initially, Ken and Carrie's children were not happy to be at the retreat, but that soon started to change. "After a few hours their attitudes began to soften," Ken recalls. "By the end, they were both having a great time and didn't want to leave."

Playing foursquare as a family was one of the ways the family started to relax and have fun. "I was going retro and using foursquare terms from my own school days," Ken laughs, "and the kids were sharing their own terminology. It's fun because the game can go on forever." The family enjoyed having some structured activities during their time at Luther Springs. But Ken says they also appreciated the flexibility. "It gave us plenty of time just to be," he says.

As the retreat wound down, Ken says he saw a big change in the way his children felt about camp. "When we were leaving they were thanking us for taking them. Both of them want to go back for events for their age groups. Because they've had this experience, they are more receptive to it now."

There, he will re-trace the cross with the water on your forehead and offer a special prayer of blessing for you (children may be accompanied by parents). There is nothing to be anxious about - everything is done quietly while the music is being played. For those who know only the

month of your Baptism, you can join us on the first Sunday of the month (if you prefer some other Sunday, please let us know). If you do not know your baptismal information, then please pick a month when you would like to celebrate this gift of God's grace in your life – and notify the office, so that we can add you to the celebration list (we'll simply mark the choice of your month with an asterisk). Even if you don't know the exact date, it's important to celebrate this special gift of God's grace in your life. Again, we encourage everyone to research your Baptismal date and find out as much information as you can – let us know if we can help!
