I went to a 60th birthday party - didn't know anyone else there - but introducing myself, I explained my relationship to the birthday girl. Our conversation immediately went to ... oh, you're from the church that does the fish fry??? ... and give out t-shirts!!! Are you doing it again this year? And oh, those desserts were soooo good! OF COURSE! It's our way of showing support for the Gamecock Campus Ministry. This was the result of the birthday girl communicating to her fellow co-workers about our Lenten Fish Fry - can you spread the word also?

Kurts Kitchen, a local food truck, is our vendor this year. Starting Friday, March 7 from 5 pm to 7 pm, you can drive-thru and get a choice of fish with fries, shrimp w/fries, or chicken tenders/w fries plus one side (okra, coleslaw or extra fries) - for \$14. Weather permitting, we'll have picnic tables outside or eat in the Fellowship Hall. Try one of our handmade desserts for an extra fee and don't forget to get your Thrivent t-shirt!

March 28, the campus ministry students will be helping and sharing their stories - come out and meet them and show your support!

#### BACKPACK FOOD MINISTRY

March, April, May - that's how many months are left to do our backpacks for Rice Creek, Joseph Keels, Blythewood Academy, and Muller Rd. If you are shopping for your weekly groceries, pick up an item (just one is a help), so we can keep this meaningful ministry going. Each week the social workers pick up their bags and emphasize how thankful and appreciative they are for our support. Most of us can't understand what hunger is when we have a pantry and refrigerator to go to, to satisfy our pangs or urges. Maybe a good Lenten project?

### PALMETTO PLACE & CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL

Palmetto Place, Samantha House, which houses adults that have left the unaccompanied youth house (The Oaks) are so appreciative of our once-a-month meal we provide - meat, starch, veggie or salad and a dessert. If you would like to participate, contact Karen Kranz - the meal is delivered on the 4th Thursday of the month - March 27. They are so excited that we do this, last month Samantha Gamble-Hart MHA, Community Outreach Coordinator visited on the 4th Thursday to get our picture for their newsletter.



Children's Hospital lunches are provided on the 3rd Thursday - Travis & Melanie Mooney of Carolina Deli, walk the lunches over to the 5th floor of Children's Hospital where parents & staff can take the burden of a meal off their plate. If you would like to donate to this ministry, indicate "children's hospital meal" on your envelope.

### **BUD VASES**

Mother's Day & Father's Day will be coming up - if anyone or if you know of anyone that has single bud vases that are sitting in a cupboard going unused, it would help defray our costs of having to purchase them. **Only** single bud vases please - leave them in the small kitchen.

CAB is grateful for all the support from Living Springs and its members. This past year, YOU and CAB have:

# LS LENTEN 40X40 "REFLECT GOD'S LIGHT" DRIVE

**Lutheran Services New Americans Ministry** 

**GOAL #1: Mini-Bucket Collection:** We invite you to take home a Lenten mini-Bucket. Add coins/dollars each day during Lent (\$1 per day = \$40); or, fill your bucket with Food Lion card(s), Wal-Mart card(s), gas card(s). \*\*Gift cards can also be placed in the offering plate anytime throughout Lent (or brought to the office). Food Lion cards provide groceries. Wal-Mart cards assist in work shoes, clothing, school supplies, etc. Gas cards help with transportation to work, training, doctor's appointments, etc.



**CHALLENGE GOAL #2: 40 Living Springs folks to serve as an "American Friend."** An "American Friend" volunteers about 4 total hours per month with a family, to help with basic understandings of how things work here and, more importantly, be a friendly face/voice to let the family know they are welcomed and loved.



\*\*Over the past years, we have been blessed to partner with Lutheran Services Carolinas in welcoming many refugee families forced to flee difficult, violent situations across the world (many who have been supportive of American troops, etc.). We have greeted them at the airport with our buses, quilts, pew bears & welcome signs from our CDC children. In the current environment, these families who have done everything legally are

now being mistakenly categorized and mis-labeled. Funding uncertainty has created a massive burden in providing even basic life-necessities for these families during their initial time of transition, as they acclimate to a new society, receive job training, move toward self-sufficient housing/income, etc.



# Notes from: Justice Ministry

March is an important month for getting ready for the **Nehemiah Action Monday, May 12th at 6 pm.** For new-comers to the LS Justice Ministry, the MORE Justice Nehemiah Action is the highlight of our Justice year when we go with hundreds of people of faith to ask our public officials to make changes that will make Columbia a better place for all of our neighbors. We are working to address problems with food access, neighborhood gun violence, and affordable housing.

In February we met with our MORE Justice faith neighbors in the Northeast – Rehoboth Baptist, Adams NE, and St. John Neumann –to hear updates about the issues we are working on. Take a look at the video and hear what we are doing in each problem area. Our own Gwen Furcron (Living Springs Lutheran Church) talks about our food justice campaign. Rev. James Woodley (Gill Creek Baptist Church) discusses gun violence and safety, and Father Sandy McDonald (St. John Neumann Catholic Church) highlights affordable housing. <a href="Months Indian Power Problem 22">NMT2 Issue Update Video.mp4 - Google Drive</a>

In February we also continued meeting with other agencies and groups working on these same problem areas. MORE Justice met with our own Living Springs' member Deborah DePaoli of the Institute for Child Success. Deborah helped deepen our understanding of how housing instability disproportionately harms young children, especially Black babies and toddlers in our community. A new study shows that about a quarter of Black infants and toddlers in rental households face the threat of eviction in a typical year. South Carolina has especially high eviction rates, driven by the fact that it is one of the least expensive states to file an eviction. Efforts are being made to seal eviction records to help break the cycle of housing insecurity, giving families a better chance of securing stable housing rather than being locked out of the rental market due to past hardships.

Mark your calendars now for the Nehemiah Action! Invite others to join you at the Action that night. Our goal is to bring others with us so that "People Power" can make a difference in Columbia. Together we can heed God's call in Micah 6:8: "What does the Lord require of you? To do justice, love kindness, and walk humbly with your God."

Daniel Budongo lives in rural Tanzania and has a small farm where he grows food for his wife and four children. Despite his hard work, his farm faced environmental changes and other challenges, and it wasn't producing enough to feed his family for more than a short time.

After joining a community loan group supported by ELCA World Hunger, Daniel was able to buy a motor-bike, build a simple retail shop and expand his family's farm. He also received the training and supplies he needed to start growing climate-resilient cassava.

"Now I have peace of mind," Daniel says. "My family has an assurance of sufficient food and other basic needs."
