Here in May, as we move deeper into the **great 50-day celebration of Easter Season**, I find great wonder in reflecting upon the events of that first Easter Sunday: God's great victory of love over the powers of darkness & death; the miraculous empty tomb; the message of Good News shared with the women; the risen Jesus calling Mary by name and comforting her amidst her tears; Christ on the Emmaus road that afternoon opening the Scriptures; and then later that evening appearing to the disciples in their locked room of fear, to offer them peace. It truly all reflects the core of our faith!

And yet, I also marvel over **everything that happened beyond that first Easter Sunday**: the Risen Christ's re-appearance in that same locked room a week later to offer peace to Thomas; Christ's appearance on the shore to cook breakfast for exhausted fishermen; Christ's heart-to-heart dialogue with Peter by the campfire to offer him restoration (after all Peter's earlier denials); Christ's ascension & great commission for his disciples on a mountaintop; the gift of the Holy Spirit to those disciples on Pentecost; and then... (as we read this month in our "Streams of Light" Bible focus) the hope-filled ministry of Jesus for all people continuing through those disciples & the amazing spread of the Good News of Jesus throughout the whole world!

Similarly, I look back on all the wonders God worked here among this community of disciples in the days surrounding Easter 2025: the powerful Lenten dramas; the inspiration of our Lenten study about the meaning of the cross for our lives; the little Lenten mini-buckets of hope for Lutheran Services refugee families; dozens of Easter cards/bags for Rice Estate & homebound; 40+ people (plus 2 dogs & a baby in the womb!) publicly (Continued on page 3)

Oh, so much wonder! And yet, we now marvel at how the Spirit of the Risen Christ will be at work among us in these days beyond Easter Sunday!







# Notes from: Living Springs Child Development Center

### From Tammy Mancuso, Director

As the days begin to warm and the sun shines a bit longer, we see the excitement as the children get ready for T-ball practice, we listen as they tell us how they are learning to play golf and taking swim lessons, and we share how we also are enjoying a little extra time outside in the evenings.

As a society, we are often focused on what children can learn from us. However, whether you are a parent, an aunt, an uncle, a grandparent, or someone who has the opportunity to share in the life of a child, let us be mindful of what they have to teach us.

What WE can learn from children at play:

- To be Fearless in your exploration, have a sense of adventure, and a willing openness to theunknown and sometimes awkward.
- Build Resilience, kids fall, maybe get a band-aid, get up, and keep going. They remind us that falling is trying and if you never try, you'll never know what you can achieve.
- Live in the Present, children are fully immersed in their work of play. They are fully present as they draw images on the sidewalk with chalk, as they watch a lizard run across the fence, as they pour sand from one container to the next. Children are focused on what is now, without concern for the perfect social media post, or how they may look. They are focused on the present, a simple reminder and inspiration of the joy in simplicity.
- Love without limits or judgment; children who don't look alike, aren't the same age, and may not speak the same language come together to laugh, run, connect, and engage because this is what we are created to do.

The next time you have the opportunity to be with children I urge you to listen, see, enjoy, and take a little lesson from them; remember to play, love, explore, and be present.



#### LENTEN 40X40 MINI-BUCKETS: \$1483 toward \$1600 goal!

Thanks to everyone who has already turned in mini-buckets and gift cards to support our Lenten 40x40 drive for Lutheran Services local refugee families! To date, we have \$1483 toward our annual 40x40=\$1600 Lenten Goal. Mini-buckets with coins & dollars can still be brought to church, or donations/checks/gift cards can be placed in the offering. \*\*Needed gift cards are Food Lion (for groceries), Wal-Mart (for work shoes, clothing, school supplies, etc.), and Gas Cards (to help with transportation to work, training, doctor's appointments, etc.).



### **Backpack Food Ministry**

This will be our last month of the school year to pack for four schools -- Rice Creek (30 bags), Joseph Keels (25 bags), Blythewood Academy (15 bags), and Muller Rd. Middle (10 bags). What an amazing outreach to provide food for the weekend to kids who don't have the luxury of just looking in the pantry and getting something to eat. For whatever reason, and it is not up to us to judge, there are over 500 children in Richland 2 alone that benefit from this program. Thank you to all that helped pack, provided food items, helped at our stuff a bus event, our CDC after-schoolers - together we made it work and look forward to doing it again in August!

#### **FAMILY PROMISE SUPPORT**

"Our mission is to help families experiencing homelessness achieve sustainable independence within the greater Columbia and Lexington areas." Living Springs has been a support church since this program started in the Columbia area around 2014 - back when rooms were temporarily set up in the host churches. Our role has been to provide meals for the families being supported - right now there are four families in the program. May is our month and Spring Valley Presbyterian is the host church. Living Springs will be providing meals the second and third week of May. As a gift for the four mothers, we will also present them with the Mother's Day flowers that we do for Rice Estate and our homebound women.

For the w/o 5/13: our menu is pasta & broccoli, sausage (bratwurst, Italian), salad, and dessert.

For the w/o 5/20: our menu is meatloaf, mashed potatoes, green beans, and a dessert.

<u>The family profiles are</u>: <u>Bellamy</u>: mother and two daughters (11 & 8); <u>Young</u>: mother and one daughter (11); <u>Caldwell</u>: mother and one son (17); <u>Buckhanon</u>: mother and two daughters (16 & 5)

We will also be collecting grocery & household items: laundry detergent peanut butter, jelly, snack cakes, bread, dish detergent, canned vegetables, rice - if this type donation is more suitable for you and of course, a monetary donation always works. - Updates on city safety from the City of Columbia Office of Neighborhood Safety and Engagement.





The GraceWorks Leadership Team is incredibly excited for our 12<sup>th</sup> annual GraceWorks Youth Servant Camp here in the Midlands!

Here's some key information for congregations, adult volunteers, youth, and parents. What is GraceWorks? GraceWorks is a local servant camp for Midlands Youth who are rising 6th graders through recently graduated 12th graders. GraceWorks develops servant leaders as these youth serve various agencies around the Columbia area. Most of these agencies serve vulnerable

children or adults. In addition to doing physical labor like painting, cleaning, yardwork, and organizing, youth also learn about the ministry of these agencies and often have opportunities to interact with those they are serving.

**What does it cost:** This year's cost will be \$25\* per youth, this covers supplies, snacks, and our recreation day for all our participants.

\*Cost should never be a deciding factor for any youth. If the cost is a barrier please reach out to Pastor Eric for scholar-ship information.

Where is GraceWorks this year? Ebenezer Lutheran Church, 1301 Richland Street, Columbia, 29201. This will be our home base, most of our service experiences will involve traveling offsite via bus or by foot.

When is GraceWorks this year? This year GraceWorks begins Sunday July 13th with a meal and worship. We will gather at Ebenezer from 5:00-7:00pm to get to know each other, learn about our service agencies for the week, and worship together. Monday through Friday, July 14th-18th, we will gather between 8:00 and 8:15am to start our day and will be finished and ready for pickup at 5:00pm. Your congregation youth leader will make sure you arrive and depart on time.

#### **Best Ever Pound Cake**—submitted by Dottie Lowman

1/2 lb. butter3 C. plain flour1C. Sweet milk3 C. sugar1/2 tsp. baking powder1 tsp. vanilla flavoring1 Tbsp. (heaping) Crisco1 pinch salt1tsp. lemon flavoring

Cream butter, sugar an Crisco. Add eggs one at a time. Beat until it looks like ice cream. Add baking powder an salt to flour. Alternately add flour and milk, heating well. Add vanilla and lemon flavoring. Bake in tube pan at 300 degrees for 1 hour and 40 minutes.

#### **Celebrate Your Baptism**

Don't forget to check the bulletin to see if we will be celebrating your Baptismal Anniversary during this month's Sunday worship services. Immediately below the Gathering Music, there are printed the names of those who are



celebrating a baptismal anniversary *in that week*. When the gathering music begins, individuals can quietly come forward to meet Pastor Eric at the baptismal fountain. There, he will re-trace the cross with the water on your forehead and offer a special prayer of blessing for you (children may be accompanied by parents). There is nothing to be anxious about - everything is done quietly while the music is being played. For those who know only the month of your Baptism, you can join us on the first Sunday of the month (if you prefer some other Sunday, please let us know). If you do not know your baptismal information, then please pick a month when you would like to celebrate this gift of God's grace in your life – and notify the office, so that we can add you to the celebration list (we'll simply mark the choice of your month with an asterisk).
